PFF REGISTERED AS A CATSI ORGANISATION AND NEW RECONCILIATION ACTION PLAN FOR 2024

THE POLLY FARMER FOUNDATION IS NOW OFFICIALLY UNDER A RECONCILIATION ACTION PLAN





The Foundation is now officially under a Reconciliation Action Plan (RAP). Actions as outlined in the plan have already begun, and as a part of the first step, Danny Ford conducted a cultural awareness workshop for the PFF staff. This workshop was long overdue, and we are honoured to have Danny Ford come in and run our first session.

FOUNDATION NOW AN ABORIGINAL CORPORATION WITH SUCCESSFUL CATSI REGISTRATION

The Foundation is now registered as a corporation under the Corporations Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander (CATSI) Act 2006. Our new official name is The Graham (Polly) Farmer Foundation Aboriginal Corporation and our Indigenous Corporation Number is 9923. Our trading name remains the Polly Farmer Foundation and we are still registered with the ACNC as a not for profit entity.

Being a registered CATSI organisation has been a goal of the Foundation and better aligns with our vision and long term objective to be an Aboriginal led organisation. We are thrilled to welcome four new board members in 2023 with six of our seven current Board members identifying as Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander.



Reflecting on my 12 years since graduating high school, I am amazed to realize that I have now been out of school for as long as I was in school. However, what truly inspires me is the consistent support that The Polly Farmer Foundation provided me throughout my post-secondary journey. Their unwavering dedication has been a driving force in my success.

I have found the work I've done with PFF to be the most rewarding and impactful. One program that had a significant impact on my journey was the Albany Follow the Dream program. Through this program, I had the opportunity to work with students in the same position as I did in high school. This experience helped me decide to work towards improving policies that affect First Nations peoples in Australia. My connection with the Polly Farmer Foundation didn't end there, though.

This year, I hosted the Polly Farmer Foundation Careers breakfast at RAC Arena, where I shared my story with students and stakeholders. This experience led me to connect with the staff at Fremantle College, where I began working as an Aboriginal and Islander Education Officer. Through this role, I had the privilege of collaborating with Polly Farmer again and attending the Worley Challenge in Broome. This event allowed students to connect with Worley staff and learn about various post-school pathways. I am grateful for these experiences and the chance to inspire and empower students to pursue their dreams.
