FOLLOW THE DREAM WINS WANAIDOC 'PROGRAM OF THE YEAR'





BILYA BOORN SCHOLARSHIP FOR COMMERCIAL LAW STUDENTS

Will you be studying law in 2025? The Bilya Boorn Scholarship supports Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander law students through financial assistance (up to \$10,000pa), mentoring and professional development opportunities in commercial law. Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students who are enrolled or intend to enrol to study law at Western Australian universities are eligible to apply. The scholarship is funded by a collection of law firms, with Paige Littlefair announced as the first recipient earlier this year.

The Polly Farmer community canvas has found its forever home after being officially unveiled by long time partner, the WA Department of Education, at their East Perth office earlier this year.

The 6m long reconciliation community canvas was the inspiration of Mt Lawley Outreach coordinator Tina Deegan, who wanted to honour Polly's famous quote:

"Education is key for Aboriginal people to take their rightful place in modern Australian society"

With the help of Broome FTD alumni artist Marlie Albert and Mt Lawley FTD students at Yanchep with Dr Noel Nannup, Polly's quote has been turned into a magnificent artwork. A true community reconciliation project with input from Follow the Dream alumni and PCs, and Polly Farmer Foundation staff, board members, and colleagues all contributing to the artwork.

Mt Lawley alumni Maddi Byron, alongside students from Dandjoo Darbalung (St Catherine's College), also played an instrumental part in completing the canvas.

Acting Director General Jim Bell thanked Tina and the Foundation for gifting the artwork to the Department where it hangs with pride, inspiring hundreds of Department of Education WA employees who view it every day.

Eighteen Follow the Dream students from across Australia attended The Law Society of Western Australia - Youth Civics Leadership Day for Aboriginal Youth at Supreme Court Gardens. The year 10 students were awarded places based on their civic awareness and desire to be future leaders; values which form a large part of what it means to be a Polly Farmer FTD student.

Throughout the day, students listened to Elders, met mentors, role models and members of the legal fraternity, participated in cultural activities, and attended a leadership session with our very own Kim Farmer, alongside panelists Wayne Nannup, Sasha Greenoff and Roy Blurton from the Aboriginal Legal Service of WA.

It was great as always to have so many FTD alumni involved including Bree Yarran, Taleah Ugle, Cheroke Ugle, Isaiah McKenna and MC for the event Marleigh Zada.

WORLEY 2024 INNOVATION CHALLENGE MELBOURNE

Follow the Dream students from Centralian Senior College (Alice Springs), St Mary's College (Broome), Fremantle, Governor Stirling, and Geelong programs had the trip of a lifetime, travelling to Melbourne for a Worley STEM Innovation Challenge in late 2024. Students were joined by alumni Wendy Torres, Aaron Haji Ali, Brittney Andrews and Emily McGuinness.

<u>Challenge one:</u> Students were hosted by Origin Energy where they enjoyed lunch with Origin employees who shared their exciting STEM education and career journeys. Students then engaged in building hands on, real-world renewable energy projects including a wind turbine and water filtration system.

<u>Challenge two:</u> Students were hosted at Worley's Melbourne office, participating in a 'STEM Shark Tank' activity. Working in groups, students investigated and developed solutions to real world environmental issues in different regions across Australia.

<u>Challenge three:</u> INCO Academy invited students to become 'Solar Buddies', working together to assemble portable solar power battery light kits that will be delivered to developing communities in Papua New Guinea. Each kit has a 10 year portal light life span and will be gifted to school students who live with homes without electricity so they have light to study with. Students also wrote a personal letter of support to accompany each kit!

Students also had the opportunity to visit Melbourne Zoo, the MCG where Polly Farmer's portrait hangs in the Hall of Fame, and the Royal Melbourne Institute of Technology university. Fremantle FTD students visited their program partner Zenith Interiors Sandringham factory to learn about career paths in interior and furniture design.

Earlier this year, the Foundation welcomed primary students to our first WA metro-based Follow the Dream program for primary school aged students.

Kim Farmer (daughter of Polly Farmer and Vice Chair of the PFF Board) visited the program to welcome students, talking about her late father's vision, saying "dad established the Foundation over 25 years ago so Aboriginal people could become leaders and take their rightful place in society".

The new Kwinana FTD program will focus on STEM learning for students in years 5 to 6, operating from Gilmore Secondary College (a few rooms down from our existing secondary students FTD program). Five primary schools are already on board, including: Bertram Primary School, Orelia Primary School, Wellard Village Primary School, Leda Primary School and Calista Primary School. With more schools soon to join!

NEW GEELONG FOLLOW THE DREAM SCHOOL PROGRAM

This year the Foundation commenced official delivery of its first program in Victoria, Geelong Follow the Dream. The program operates at Northern Bay College, supporting Year 9-12 students at the school's Goldsworthy Campus and it set to welcome students in Years 7&8 next year. Geelong FTD is strongly supported by the program's local Guidance Group, representing a range of key stakeholders including Wadawurrung traditional owners, members of the local Aboriginal education consultative group (LAECG), Wathaurong Aboriginal Co-operative, elders and community members. The Foundation holds a deep connection with Geelong; Polly's history and legacy is very much alive in the region and it is the Foundation's privilege to deliver his vision on Wadawurrung country. We look forward to expanding the program to support students at Western Heights College next year. The Geelong FTD program is kindly supported by program sponsors, Woomera Education Scholarships Trust (WEST) and the Bertalli Family Trust.
