Measuring What Matters

Independent Research by ThirdStory

The Polly Farmer Foundation partnered with ThirdStory to research the social impact of *Follow the Dream*, our academic enrichment program for aspiring Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander school students.

The evaluation reached hundreds of people across Australia, including:



130 current students



24 recent alumni



family members



19Program
Coordinators

Participants came from metro and regional areas across Australia where *Follow the Dream* is delivered. Their stories build a national picture of *Follow the Dream*'s reach, relevance and long-term impact.

What the Evaluation Told Us

Follow the Dream is delivering lasting impact in the classroom and beyond.

Grounded in culture, driven by purpose and backed by community—the program continues to show what's possible when the right supports are in place.

Here's what stands out:

- Students in Follow the Dream attend school more often and achieve better results than their non-participating peers.
- More students are completing Year 12, attaining WACE and qualifying for ATAR.
- Confidence, cultural identity and a sense of connection are clear outcomes of the program.
- Alumni are pursuing university, TAFE, and meaningful careers.
- Families and Coordinators see the impact lasting well beyond the classroom.



The results are clear. *Follow the Dream* is empowering Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander young people to succeed on their own terms and is shaping a stronger, more equitable future in the process.

"Without Follow the Dream, I wouldn't have built my resume, finished Year 12. I'd probably still be living with my grandmother or brother. I definitely wouldn't have the life I have now if it wasn't for Follow the Dream."

The Evidence Is In

Real results from a program that works.

This is what impact looks like:



72% of *Follow the Dream* Year 12 students achieved WACE in 2024. [Compared to 43% all Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students*]



96% of alumni said the program encouraged them to aim higher after school



100% said *Follow the Dream* helped them follow their dream

"Follow the Dream has given me a support system within school and encouraged me to aim for pathways I never thought I was capable of before joining the program."

88% said it made them more confident



75% of alumni and **55%** of current students said it made school more enjoyable



74% of students said they know they can turn to program staff for help

Follow the Dream delivers results because it combines academic support and trusted relationships.

Local leadership

Coordinators know their schools and build trusted relationships that help students thrive.



Long-term support

The program supports students across multiple years. That consistency makes a difference.



Personalised approach

Support is shaped to each student's goals.



Strong partnerships


Schools, families and partners work alongside the program to back student success.
